Genesis 12: 1-8, 18 - Abram shows his faith in God and leaves Haran with his wife Sarai and nephew Lot. God promises Abram "I will bless you and make you a great and famous nation. All the people on earth will be blessed through you."

Genesis 21: 1-7 - Sarah and Abraham have a baby boy that was promised by God. They named him Isaac meaning 'he laughs'.

THE COMING OF JESUS

Each of the evangelists tells of the coming of Jesus in a different way.

Luke and Matthew tell the stories of the childhood of Jesus. (pp69-79)

Jesus' birth was Good News to the poor shepherds (Luke), to rich men (Matthew), to the Jewish people (Luke) and the Gentiles – people who were not Jews (Matthew).

The first message is: Jesus has come to all. The baby in the manger is Christ the Lord. Jesus the promised Saviour is worthy of homage, adoration and praise.

Mark tells of the Baptism of Jesus. (p80)

John's beginning is like a beautiful poem: Jesus is good news for the whole world. (p81)

FROM THE BEGINNING

The Gospel according to Luke

also gives a family tree, but Luke

goes all the way back to Adam,

the first man. Luke is saying that

Jesus is for the whole human

family. (Luke 3:23-38)

A FAMILY TREE (based on Matthew 1:1-17)

Matthew begins with a family tree. He wants his Jewish listeners to know that Jesus is a descendant of Abraham and of David the great king.

Jesus came from a long line of ancestors

that we can trace right back to Abraham.

From Abraham to King David the list includes:

Abraham, the father of Isaac,

Isaac, the father of Jacob,

Jacob, the father of Judah and his brothers.

Boaz was the father of Obed, Ruth being his mother,

Obed was the father of Jesse,

and Jesse was the father of King David.

David was the father of Solomon.

Finally we come to Mathan who was the father of Jacob and Jacob was the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, the mother of Jesus who is called Christ.

THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL (based on Genesis 35:9-15, 23-26)

God blessed Jacob. God gave him the name Israel.

Jacob had twelve sons:

Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Zebulon, Joseph, Benjamin, Dan, Naphtali, Gad and Asher.

These twelve sons are regarded as the fathers of the twelve tribes of Israel. In the Bible the People of God are often called 'children of Israel'.

JOSEPH (based on Genesis 37:3, 4, 12, 13, 18-28, 31-33)

Israel loved Joseph more than all his other sons. He had a beautiful coat made for him. It was long and had full sleeves. Joseph's brothers hated him because he was their father's favourite. They hardly ever spoke a friendly word to him.

One day, when his brothers were out in Schechem looking after the sheep, Israel said to Joseph, "Go and see how your brothers are and how the sheep are doing, then come back and tell me."

When his brothers saw Joseph coming they planned to kill him. Reuben tried to save him. "Let's not hurt him. Let's just throw him down this well."

They ripped off his beautiful long robe with the full sleeves and threw him down the well, which was dry. Then they sat down to eat.

While they were eating some merchants came by on their way to Egypt. Judah said, "Why don't we sell Joseph to these merchants instead of leaving him here in this well to die?"

So they pulled Joseph out of the well and sold him for twenty pieces of silver. The merchants took Joseph to Egypt.

Joseph's brothers took his beautiful robe, dipped it in the blood of a goat, which they had killed, and had it taken to their father. When Jacob saw the robe he knew that it was Joseph's and he wept for his son.
