# Valehouse Pentecost I Newsletter


Welcome back Valehouse, I hope you have enjoyed your Easter break!

During this half term, we will be exploring the following genres and texts

## <u>History</u>

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## Science

Valehouse will be exploring two questions in science this half; 'How far can I throw my shadow' and 'Why is the music by Ed Sheeran loved by so many?'

## Year Three - Light

During this topic, the children will

- Know that they need light in order to see things.
- Know that dark is the absence of light.
- Know that light is reflected from surfaces
- Know that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes
- Know that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object
- Know how that the size and shape of shadows change

### Year Four - Sound

During this topic, the children will

- Know how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating
- Know that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear
- Know the correlation between pitch and features of the object that produced the sound.
- Know the correlation between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it
- Know that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases
