English

The Raven—Edgar Allen Poe


We will begin the half term focussing on The Raven poem by Edgar Allan Poe. We will discuss what a narrative poem is, analyse the poem looking at the effectiveness of the vocabulary used and the rhyming



structure. We will then go on to write our own narrative poem.

Floodland—Marcus Sedgwick

Imagine that a few years from now England is covered by water, and Norwich is an island. Zoe, left behind in the confusion when her parents escaped, survives there as best she can. Alone and desperate among marauding gangs, she manages to dig a derelict boat out of the mud and gets away to Eels Island. But Eels Island, whose raggle-taggle inhabitants are dominated by the strange boy Dooby,



is full of danger too. The belief that she will one day find her parents spurs Zoe on to a dramatic escape in a story of courage and determination that is handled with warmth and humanity.

- Record and interpret data on the effects of penicillin using a scatter graph.
- Understand the life of Mary Leakey and her work about fossils.
- Label the parts and functions of the heart and explain Dr Daniel Hale Williams' accomplishments.
- Understand how Steve Jobs used electronics to design computers.

Geography

Mapping

I'm a Year 6 pupil, how can I get out of here?



During this topic, the children will:


- find countries in Europe and North and South America on a map.
- find cities in the UK on a map and identify some of their features.
- find information in an atlas using the index and simple co-ordinates.
- use a key to describe features on an Ordnance Survey map
- use the eight compass points to describe routes on a map
- plan a journey using the eight compass points and four or six-figure grid references.
- describe how land use has changed over time.

Guided Reading

In our Guided Reading sessions we will carry on reading the book, **Wonder.**



There will also be a focus on our main text, **Floodland**, as we explore the book in detail during our English and Guided Reading sessions.



We will be using the Reading Vipers techniques of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieve and summarise to engage and understand the text in depth.
