Welcome to Ladybower! Here's an overview of what we will be learning about this half term.

English

The Golden Horsemen of Baghdad



Set in Baghdad, around AD 900, the story follows a young boy - Jabir - as he fights for his family's survival and to follow his own dreams and passions. He forms a friendship with Yasmina that helps unlock potential and together they solve problems, survive disaster and learn more about themselves.

We will explore this book in-depth looking at the different characters and their roles in the story. We will also research the history of Baghdad and what it would have been like to live there during this time to gain an insight into the time period of when this story was set.

The children will write their own portal story, imagining as if they found themselves in the middle of Baghdad in AD 900 describing what their life would be like. They will then produce a non-chronological report on Baghdad, using everything they have learnt in this topic to illustrate the extraordinary place Baghdad was at this time in history.

RECreation and Covenant

- Give reasons for classifying animals based on their similarities and differences
- Describe how living things are classified into groups.
- Identify the characteristics of different types of animals.
- Classify a creature based on its characteristics
- Describe and investigate helpful and harmful microorganisms.
- Identify the characteristics of different types of microorganisms.
- Classify organisms found in my local habitat
- Explain the classification of organisms found in my local habitat

<u>History</u>

The Early Islamic Civilisation


During this topic, the children will:



- Find out about
 Baghdad's role in the early Islamic Civilisation
- Find out about the House of Wisdom and how it became a centre for learning
- Explain some of the significant discoveries and studies which were led by early Islamic scholars and evaluate the impact they made to the wider world
- Describe who Muhammad is, how the first caliphate came to be formed and explain the roles and responsibilities of a caliph
- Identify and talk about different forms of Islamic art and create my own geometric pattern based on traditional techniques
- Identify why the early Islamic Civilisation became a major power, know about the Silk Road trade route and describe the methods used by early Islamic chemists.

Guided Reading

In our Guided Reading sessions we will be reading the book, 'Journey to Jo'burg'.



Mma lives and works in Johannesburg, far from the village thirteen-year-old Naledi and her younger brother, Tiro, call home. When their baby sister suddenly becomes very sick, Naledi and Tiro know, deep down, that only one person can save her. Bravely, alone, they set off on a journey to find Mma and bring her back.

We will be using the Reading Vipers techniques of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieve and summarise to engage and understand the text in depth.

How can you help?
