
During this half term, we will be exploring the following genres and texts


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Science

Valehouse will be exploring Forces and Magnets this half term. During this topic, the children will

- Compare how things move on different surfaces
- Know that forces need contact between two objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance
- Know that magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others
- Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials

Know that magnets have two poles

The children will -

- Know how Britain changed between the beginning of the stone age and the iron age
- Know the significance of sites like Stonehenge and Skara Brae
- Know the main differences between the stone, bronze and iron ages
- Know what is meant by "settlements"
- Know what is meant by 'hunter-gatherers'



Guided Reading


Stone Age Boy

Please ensure your child brings a healthy snack and a bottle of water every day. Unfortunately the Government free fruit scheme is only open to infant children and we cannot depend on there being any left over.

Tuck shop is open on Fridays, with a selection of treats for 50p. Alternatively your child may bring in a cereal bar or crisps as their Friday treat.

This half term, the children in Valehouse will have Forest School on **Thursdays**, so will need to bring their outdoor kit, and they will have swimming on **Tuesdays**. Please ensure they come to school wearing their swim suit under their PE kit to help with start time for the lesson.

Spellings are tested on a Friday, and a new list is given out on Fridays. Spellings can be accessed on Spelling Shed and the children's logins are in their reading diary.

Spelling Shed/Maths Shed - please ensure your child is accessing these regularly at home. It will help to embed their spellings and improve fluency particularly with times tables.
