




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Guided Reading

Science

Forces - This half term, Derwent class will be diving into the fascinating world of forces. We'll explore various concepts such as gravity, friction, and magnetism, as well as how these forces affect our everyday lives. Our aim is to help the children understand not only the theoretical aspects of forces but also their practical applications through hands-on experiments and engaging activities.

By the end of this unit children will be able to:

- Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object;
- Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction.
- Recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

As part of Wider Music Opportunities, Derwent class will be having samba drumming lessons on Wednesdays each week. Don't worry we won't be sending drums home to practise!

Art / DT

Using their other topics as inspiration, Derwent will be developing their art and DT skills to create art around Holes, Forces, and New York City.
