Derwent Lent 2 Newsletter


Welcome back Derwent! I hope we are all ready for another amazing half term leading up to Easter!

English

Throughout this half term, we will be diving into the captivating story of "Manfred the Baddie." The children will compose persuasive letters to join Manfred's gang, which will encourage them to think about the purpose and structure of formal letters in a creative context.

Additionally, they will write wanted reports, encouraging them to think critically about character motivations and the consequences of their actions. Finally, the children will craft an explanation text on an evil invention of their own, allowing them to

blend creativity with informative writing.



Computing

This half term, our computing lessons will focus on vector drawings. The children will explore

how these drawings are created, their various applications, and the important role graphic designers play in our digital world.




Maths

Our focus in maths will be on fractions and decimals, concepts that are not only essential for this curriculum, but also valuable life skills.

In our fractions unit, students will be simplifying fractions, as well as adding, subtracting, and multiplying them. These topics can initially seem daunting, but with practice and encouragement, your child will gain confidence and proficiency. To support their learning at home, you might consider engaging them in real-life scenarios, such as sharing food items or dividing money, which can make these concepts more real.

On the decimal side, we will explore tenths and hundredths, helping students to understand these values. Additionally, we will delve into the fascinating world of percentages. By the end of this unit, your child will be able to calculate percentages of various numbers, a skill that is increasingly important in everyday situations.



RE

The Big Question this half term in RE - How do we, as Christians, prepare ourselves for Lent?



In Derwent, we are looking at parables including The Prodigal Son, The Judgement of Nations, and others in the Gospel. These parables will be linked to how we can better our lives as Christians, and how we can show others mercy. Our Catholic Social Teaching theme looks at Rights and Responsibilities. Derwent will continue to take part and lead class 'Celebrations of the Word'.



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Guided Reading

Science

In Science, Derwent will be focusing on the development of animals including humans. Throughout this topic, we will explore gestation periods of various mammals, examining how long different species develop before birth. We will also delve into prenatal development, discussing how babies grow and change before they are born. This will provide a fascinating insight into the complexities of life itself. Furthermore, we will look at how humans grow and evolve throughout their lives, considering the various stages—from infancy to adulthood and into old age.

To enrich the learning experience, we encourage you to engage with your child about mammals and human

development at home. Discussing family milestones and sharing personal growth stories can help them make connections between their own experiences and the scientific concepts we are studying..



Design & Technology

Throughout this term, the children will discover how different climates affect food growth across the globe. They will engage with the idea of seasonal ingredients, testing and understanding the flavours and benefits that come with each season. This hands-on approach will not only enhance their culinary skills but also foster a greater appreciation for the environment and sustainable practices.

Towards the end of the term, we will be evaluating a seasonal recipe, allowing the children to showcase what they have learnt. It would be wonderful if you could support their learning at home by discussing seasonal fruits and vegetables, perhaps even trying a few recipes together!
