

How can we use the gifts of the Holy Spirit to be better disciples of God?

- Identify that scripture speaks of the outpouring of gifts of the Holy Spirit on the Messiah in the Old Testament and the gospels.
- Show knowledge and understanding of the religious actions and signs involved in the celebration of confirmation.
- Describe the gifts of the Holy Spirit and some ways they help Christians be good disciples.

- Describe the names and signs under which the Holy Spirit appears.
- Know that the Rosary is a prayerful reflection on the life of Christ and explain what the glorious mysteries remember.
- Wonder about the Holy Spirit in the life of Jesus and mystery of the Holy Trinity.
- Express a preference for an artistic representation of the Holy Spirit.
- Reflect on the links between the words chrism and Christian and what it means for Christians to be anointed for Christ today.
