Our second piece of writing will be based around our Guided Reading book, Wonder.


We will be discussing the argument, 'Should August go to school?' We will explore arguments for both sides and come up with our own decision.

Dialogue and Encounter



- Explain that the Bible came together over a period of more than a thousand years and contains sacred texts from Judaism, the four Gospels, and other early writings of the Church


- Using Atlases—find countries in Europe, North and South America.

We will be using the Reading Vipers techniques of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieve and summarise to engage and understand the text in depth.
